2015 - 2016 - 2019 -	Supermarket attack: Four Jews were murdered by an Islamist terrorist during a hostage situation Moscow, St Petersburg: Jews expelled. 11 Jews were murdered during Shabbat services in the deadliest antisemitic attack in U.S. history. One person was killed and three injured during a Passover service in a synagogue by a white supremacist gunman. Sukkot attack at Hamburg synagogue.	2023 onwards 2024	In the aftermath, global antisemitism surged: • Pro-Hamas rallies celebrated the attacks. • Jews were harassed, assaulted, and synagogues vandalised across Europe, North America, and Australia. • Schools and Jewish institutions received bomb threats and hate mail. Synagogues firebombed, Jewish girl raped, Jewish Homes vandalised. Synagogues attacked with fire and swastikas Two Messianic Jewish Israeli embassy workers, were murdered in a targeted shooting after a Jewish diplomatic event.
